How to find them in the ICC class schedule...

1. In the **complete schedule**, look for the **Type** column for **linked, www, hybridwww** or **television**.

Complete Fall Schedule Classes are listed first in their entirety and then broken out into the following categories: Downtown Peoria Campus, North Campus, ICC South, Ministers, 12HR Classes, Closed-Circuit TV, 1st 8-Weeks, 2nd 8-Weeks, Correspondence, Television, Web, Hybrid, Linked, Weekend College, Off-Campus & Noncredit Classes

3. Also be sure to pay attention to the **Prerequisites/Notes** listed in the far right column of the schedule!

Linked Classes -- Linked classes are two different classes taught by different faculty, but the same students are enrolled in both classes; this improves student interaction to increase student success.

Who should take a linked class? A student who is interested in learning a skill in one class and putting it to use in another. A student whose schedule can accommodate both classes and who will remain enrolled in both classes the entire term.

FACT: Research shows students in linked classes are more likely to stay enrolled in the classes and stay in school.

Web Classes (www) -- A Web class is delivered online instead of in a traditional classroom. Faculty may require campus visits or proctored exams; see the class syllabus and requirements for more information.

Who should take a web class? A student who likes to read, write and who has the time needed to take a traditional class but who prefers using a computer and the Internet to do coursework. A student who is self-directed and motivated to do work on his or her own.

FACT: Web classes are not easier nor do they take less time. Web classes require as much if not more time than a traditional class. Web classes have specific deadlines and due dates for assignments.

Web classes require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.

Hybrid (face-to-face/online) Classes -- A Hybrid class is delivered through face-to-face instruction and the Internet. Classroom time is reduced but not eliminated. A hybrid class requires as much work as a traditional class but has an active and required online component.

Who should take a hybrid class? A student who wants to blend interacting with the instructor and classmates in class with required online coursework.

FACT: Because of the reduced time, hybrid classes require students to prepare for classes in advance so the time in class can be used for meaningful discussion and activities.

Hybrid classes require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.

Television Classes - A Television class is delivered on cable television or viewed from video tape or DVD checked out from a library. Campus visits may be required.

Who should take a television class? A student who is self-directed and motivated to do work without being face-to-face with the instructor and other students in a classroom setting.

FACT: Television classes may require campus visits and proctored exams. A television student will receive course materials and assignment guidelines from the instructor via US mail, email and/or the Internet.

Television classes may require access to a reliable computer and a stable connection to the Internet.
