Because of the overlap between the Environmental Studies curriculum and that of ECCE requirements and courses for the minor, it will not normally require additional time to pursue a minor.


A minimum of four electives chosen for the Environmental Studies degree should be at the 400 level; remaining electives should be 300 or 400 level.




