Program Description- BSN

The Methodist College Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree prepares students for the national licensing exam (NCLEX) to be licensed as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Students may enter this program directly from high school or as transfer students. Students with college credits will have those credits evaluated for transferability into the Methodist College BSN program.

In the Pre-Licensure BSN program, students will take both the general education and nursing courses required for the degree, but unlike "Pre-Nursing" programs offered by other colleges and universities, Methodist College students enter the program as Nursing majors and will take nursing courses in their first year, even in their first semester.

As an undergraduate degree, the Pre-Licensure BSN program requires four years of full time study, or can be completed quicker depending on transfer of general education courses. Regardless of transfer credits, the program does require a three year clinical rotation.

This program is also designed so that it may be attended on a part-time basis. If attending part time, the student may take up to seven years to complete the degree. Courses are offered at a variety of times, including some online, blended, and evening classes.

Upon completion of the required 122 credits, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree will be awarded and the graduate will then be qualified to sit for the state licensing exam, NCLEX. Upon passing this exam, the graduate will be licensed as a registered nurse, or "RN".

Minimum Admissions Requirements

First Time Freshmen (under 30 college credits earned)

- 2.5 high school GPA (3.0 is preferred)
- 19 ACT score
- Personal statement and references (not required, but recommended)

Transfer Students (over 30 college credits)

- 2.0 college GPA (2.5 is preferred)
- Personal statement and references (not required, but recommended)

Admissions Process

Methodist College accepts applications at any point during the year. To be considered for admission, you must submit the following:

- Online application and fee
- All **official** transcripts
 - First Time Freshmen (under 30 college credits earned): high school transcript or GED, all college transcripts (if applicable), official ACT score (if not on high school transcript)
 - Transfer (over 30 college credits earned): high school transcript or GED, all college transcripts
 - Personal statement and letter of recommendation (not required, but recommended)

After submitting your application, you will get a username and password for your student portal, where you can check the status of your documents.
