## **CNA and Dental Hygiene Collaboration**



Last month students from the Certified Nursing Assisting (CNA) Program and Dental Hygienist (DH) Program participated in a collaborative laboratory session for oral hygiene care for residents of nursing facilities. The goal/purpose was to create a friendly environment for a collaboration between CNA and DH students on effective personal oral hygiene, effective oral hygiene techniques for conscious and unconscious residents, proper care of prosthetic devices (dentures), and appropriate insertion and removal techniques for prosthetic devices (dentures).

CNA students were provided a pre- and post-test and rotated through three stations set up for

specific oral hygiene procedures. Many CNA students had not seen or touched a real denture. They learned the importance of providing oral care for the unconscious patient by using oral swabs. CNA students were able to reinforce the techniques presented in lecture by demonstrating techniques on peer patients and/or practicing cleaning a real denture. IDPH guidelines were provided by Ms. LaBello and incorporated into this activity.



CNA and DH faculty are discussing the possibility of adding this activity to labs each semester.

Updates with ICC fall sports teams:

Volleyball is currently (21-9) and moved up to the #10 ranked team in Division II NJCAA. They head into a huge MWAC match this week with #3 ranked Parkland College, who was last year's NJCAA National Champion. The last time Parkland visited the CougarPlex, ICC took home the win in a thrilling 5-set match victory.

Men's Soccer is currently (9-6) after a slow start to the season. They have earned the #2 seed for the Region 24 tournament, which will begin at the end of the month.

Women's Soccer is still undefeated at (11-0) and ranked #16 in the NJCAA Division I women's soccer rankings. They have gone undefeated in Region 24 play and have earned the #1 seed in the Region 24 tournament that will begin at the end of the month.

Golf is completing their fall season and has posted three Top 3 finishes during the fall season. This past week the Cougars finished 5th in the MWAC Conference Championships. The fall season will wrap up on October 17th with a match play event in Moline, Illinois, versus Black Hawk College.

Women's Basketball will be hosting their annual pre-season Jamboree at the CougarPlex on Saturday, October 8, with (20) teams from around the Midwest coming to compete.

Men's Basketball has already completed the first pre-season Jamboree at Danville last weekend, where they went (2-1). They will be on the road for their second jamboree scrimmage event next weekend for the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.





## Web

A new and improved ICC website was launched on September 22. The focus of the website is to promote the college to potential students, our alumni and the community. This has been a project that has spanned 24+ months. Although countless hours have been put into this, it is always a work in progress. It is constantly evolving as we continue to make updates and improvements.

This project began back in March 2020, when we began to plan out the RFP for the website. In November 2020, we requested proposals from



vendors, receiving 47 responses in return. After careful review, we chose Stamats as our vendor, and received the Board's approval in February of 2021. Since then, our website committee has put in more than 57 weeks of full-time work to make the new website successful.

## **Admissions Report**

**Applications**: This month, the office received 134 applications for Spring and Fall 2023. This was 50 less than our goal of 180 applications. We continue to expand our outreach and marketing to generate more interest across all audiences.

On-Campus: In the past month, the office received 32 individual visits to the office and held two visit events. Our visit days were a General Visit Day and the Agriculture, Horticulture, and Diesel Showcase. This showcase attracted over 400 students from 32 different schools.

**Off-Campus**: The office conducted 26 visits to high schools and met with nearly 100 students. The office met with nine community organizations as we continued to build our foundation, engaging with community leaders and educating them on how ICC can partner with them and their clients.

**Daily Activity**: The Admissions office engaged with more than 250 callers, and the Information Desk with over 600 callers. We work to triage and educate with prospective, current, and former students to navigate the MyICC app, making students more self-sufficient and increasing their confidence.

## **Human Resources**

The Human Resources Department converted to a digital process for personnel files in 2019. As such, all employees hired from 2019 to present only have a digital personnel file. Over the past 6 months, HR has been working on the huge project of eliminating all of the paper personnel files for both former employees and current employees prior to 2019. At this time, HR has fully digitized over 700 files with approximately 500 left to convert. This has been a huge undertaking while also working on the day-to-day tasks. Special thanks goes to Caron Wilson, HR Administrative Assistant for her diligence in continuing to work on this project and push us forward. Also, a huge thanks to the Facilities department for supporting our efforts with providing locked shred bins and subsequent confidential shredding services.
