

4 STEPS TO APPLY TO A HEALTH CAREERS PROGRAM

Complete the FAFSA. That's the Free Application for Federal Student Aid online form that you and your parents/guardians submit (if you are age 24 or younger) to be eligible to receive financial aid. [FAFSA.gov](https://fafsa.gov)

You should file the FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1 of each year for the next school year. You can tell FAFSA that you and your parents/guardians will be filing your taxes and use estimated figures for the form. Once you and your parents/guardians have filed your taxes, you both can go back to your FAFSA and use the IRS Data Retrieval Button to securely pull in tax information from the IRS database. Acceptance into an ICC Health Careers program is competitive, based on an earned point total.

Students earn points based on high school and college grade point averages (GPA),

SAT/ACT scores, previous degrees, work experience, etc.

1 Complete and submit an ICC admission form (icc.edu > Apply Now)

You must apply to ICC before you can apply to a specific Health Careers program.

2 Complete the READING placement test (icc.edu/testingCenter or 309/694-5234).

*If you wish to apply to the Nursing Assistant program complete steps 1 and 2, then call 309/999-4275

3 Meet with a Health Careers advisor

to determine program-specific eligibility. (309/690-7530)

Be prepared to answer the following*:

- To which Health Careers program do you wish to apply?
- What is your reading score?
- What was your high school GPA?
- Do you have any health career certificates, licensures, or degrees?
- Have you worked in a health career field?
- Do you have volunteer experience in a health career field?

*additional questions are program specific

... and YOU MUST bring copies of your high school and college transcripts

*If you wish to apply to the EMT program, you only need to complete steps 1, 2, and 3.

4 Submit required documentation after meeting eligibility requirements.

You must submit the following documentation to apply to a specific Health Careers program:

- Program-specific checklist
- Official transcripts from issuing institution(s)
- Health degree(s) and/or certifications
- Work/volunteer form

– INSTRUCTIONS/NOTES FOR EACH SECTION APPEAR BELOW –

A College cumulative grade point average is calculated by all points earned divided by hours attempted for all college course work you have taken. An official transcript(s) must accompany your application.

B Points based on your SAT/ACT score (generally taken your junior year of high school) OR if you have completed specific college coursework. SAT 1530 prior to March 1, 2016. ORIEN 110 and ICC 110 are ICC course numbers. See the ICC College Catalog for course descriptions.

C The point value you select for math should be based on the highest grade you received, while the science point value should be based on the most recent grade you received in chemistry, biology, or physics. MATH 098, MATH 099, and MATH 110 are ICC course numbers. See the ICC College Catalog for course descriptions.

D The point value you select should be based on the most recent grade you received in the specified courses, but the highest grade in the math course. In the case of "BIOL 205 + BIOL 206", grade is based on the average of the two.

BIOL 140, BIOL 205, BIOL 206, ENGL 110, HLTH 121, and MATH 115 are ICC course numbers. See the ICC College Catalog for course descriptions.

E Points based on a previous degree, or certification, or licensure, in any health discipline.

Examples of "other health career(s)" include but are not limited to: Nurse Assistant; EMT/Paramedic; Medical Assistant; Medical Office Administrative Assistant; Medical Lab Technician; Massage Therapist; Licensed Practical Nurse; Occupational Therapy Assistant; Physical Therapist Assistant; Respiratory Therapist; Registered Nurse; Medical Coder; Surgical Technologist; and Dental Hygienist. Call 309/690-7530 if you are unsure if you have a qualifying health career.

A copy of your license or other documentation must accompany your application.

F In this category points are awarded based on your work and/or volunteer experience.

Full time is considered 32 hours or more per week. Part time is considered less than 32 hours per week. Work or volunteer experience must involve a patient care setting or healthcare related field (see examples of "other health careers" in instructions for section E.) MLT 110 and ICC 104 are ICC course numbers. See the ICC College Catalog for course descriptions. Work/volunteer form MUST accompany your application.

G If you applied last year to the Radiographer program and were qualified but not accepted, you will be awarded 5 points.

H This is where you total up the points you have earned in sections A - G. (Note the maximum allowed for each section).

It is this number that will be a determining factor in your acceptance into the Radiographer program.
