It is a fantastic way to send off our students in a celebratory way as they continue their journey to whatever is next for them. We have seven students from this class transferring to ISU, two to Bradley, one going to NIU, and several currently making their final decisions on their selected transfer institution in the next couple of weeks.

Business, Legal, and Information Systems

Criminal Justice Dual Credit

Doug Heuermann, Criminal Justice Programs, and BLIS Dean Michelle Weghorst hosted a visit to ICC for Professor Lisa Snow and her dual credit criminal justice students from Woodruff. They took a tour and spoke to a variety of folks, including Doug Heuerman, Professor Tom Higgins, and Dean Weghorst. Dr. Oriana Gilson also a dual credit instructor, visited with the cohort of students. Below is a summary of what these students are doing during their dual credit classes at Woodruff. We are so excited about this work the students are doing in their classroom and their community, as well as the success they are making.

The 2022 graduating class of Peoria Public School students enrolled in Woodruff Career and Technical Center's (WCTC) Criminal Justice dual credit cohort is comprised of five seniors from both Peoria Central and Richwoods High Schools. As part of the Criminal Justice program, these students have been working on a yearlong, two-part community service project aimed at strengthening students' communication skills and sense of community duty as well as clearly connecting the importance of empathy and compassion to their future careers working within the criminal justice system.

The first part of their community service project is the Woodruff Buddies Program that partners WCTC criminal justice seniors with a second-grade classroom at Lincoln Primary School. In their role as mentors, each WCTC student works with the same small group of second graders each week. They read books, practice spelling words, play games, and talk about school and life in Peoria.

For the second part of their community service project, students are authoring and illustrating a chapter book titled *Legend for My Brother*. Written by Peoria kids for Peoria kids, the published text will be distributed to families of Peoria homicide victims by representatives from the Peoria Community Against Violence and OSF Strive. The chapter book will also be the centerpiece for students' community service entry at this year's Skills USA competition which is being held in Peoria.

In the fall of 2022, all five seniors plan to continue their criminal justice studies at post-secondary institutions, with two attending ICC as criminal justice majors.

Math, Science, and Engineering

Geology Student Field Experiences

Professor Cheryl Resnick's students were excited to participate in field experiences this semester for the EASC 116 – Introduction to Geology course. They explored local parks, such as Spring Creek Preserve in East Peoria, and Rocky Glen Park in West Peoria, as well as an all-day field trip to state parks in the LaSalle, Illinois area. Prof. Ed Stermer demonstrated the rock saw used to cut some of the rocks they collected in half for identification purposes. Students also visited the Augustana College geology department



where faculty and students showcased research being conducted by students. The highlight for many of the students from their visit to Augustana College was touching a 75-million-year-old dinosaur bone and seeing the bone histology in cross-section, having learned about bone histology from a podcast assignment earlier in the semester. Experiential, or hands-on, learning is essential for students to make connections between what they're learning in the classroom and applying it to the world they live in. Thank you to the ICC Board of Trustees for their continued support of our field trips.

Athletics:

Head Baseball Coach Brett Kelley won his 500th game with ICC on Saturday April 23rd against Vincennes University with a 9-1 victory. Baseball will be completing their regular season next week and begin the Region 24 Tournament on Wednesday May 18th at the Corn Crib Stadium in Normal, IL.

Workforce & Diversity

Workforce Department:

ICC Career Services, in conjunction with Health Careers and AIT, hosted three on campus job fairs in April.

The first event was held at our Pekin campus with the WEI Advanced Manufacturing Welding students. The job fair was held on April 7. Four local employers, JT Fennell, Morton Industries, Case IH, and MATCOR delivered presentations to all the students in the class about their company and their welding positions. Following the presentations, each student met with the employers for individual discussions and resume review. As a result, seven of the eleven students were invited for further interviews and weld tests at the work sites.

The Health Careers Job Fair was held on April 13 in Cedar Hall on the Peoria Campus. Twenty employers attended the event including OSF Healthcare, Unity Point Health, University of Illinois College of Medicine Peoria, Hopedale Medical Complex. Employers were excited to be able to come back to campus and speak to job applicants in person. Approximately 30 ICC students and community members spoke with employers about positions in nursing, nurse assisting, home health, and other health care fields.

On April 20, a Manufacturing Job Fair was held in the AIT building. Twenty-four employers attended including Caterpillar, Bayer Crop Science, Case IH, Morton Industries, and Natural Fiber Welding. A steady stream of over 50 students from ICC and the Woodruff CTE center, along with community job seekers attended the fair and learned about openings in fields like industrial maintenance, welding, CNC machinist, and fabrication.

Career Services gathered participant information and are following up to provide additional support in resumes, job application, and interviewing to help prepare attendees to compete for these positions.



ICC's Workforce Equity Initiative Presents at the Achieving the Dream PACCE Webinar

Achieving the Dream (AtD) invited ICC's WEI program to present on the topic of "Adult Learner Enrollment and Outreach." The presentation was held on April 26, 2022 via webinar AtD's initiative to Prioritize Adult Community College Enrollment (PACCE). The PACCE initiative is designed to identify and scale promising strategies for increasing the enrollment and reenrollment of adult students — particularly Black and Latinx students — in high-quality credit and/or non-credit programs. ICC's Workforce Equity Initiative was selected to present due to its ongoing success in exceeding grant objectives and its focus on underserved populations. Presenters included President Sheila Quirk-Bailey, Vice President Arnitria Shaw, Executive Director Paula Nachtrieb, and Workforce Manager Michelle Devore. The meeting included representatives from grades k-16 and examined the successes and areas for growth in the region. Presenters included Kari Rauh (GPEDC), Dr. Susan Grzanich (PPS), Arnitria Shaw (ICC/College and Career Readiness) and Dawn Koeltzow (ICC/GPEAK). Topics covered included CareerSpark, Transitional Math and English, Career Pathways, and the Greater Peoria Essential Abilities and Knowledge (GPEAK). The meeting concluded with Community Team Time that allowed for the start of local Action Plan Templates to address Covid-era challenges related to education and employment engagement. Illinois Central College Offering "Smart Start" & "ReStart" College Success Programs This Summer

Illinois Central College will offer "Smart Start" and "ReStart" college success programs this summer to support individuals in their transition to or transition back into college. Students are not required to enroll at ICC this fall in order to participate.

"Smart Start" is a three-week program designed to help high school seniors in their transition from high school to college. Students will practice math, English, and college success strategies in a college atmosphere. Each session includes a variety of activities to help students develop the range of skills needed to become successful college students. These activities will help students build academic skills and social connections, develop their awareness and understanding of a variety of campus resources, and encourage them to develop a strong

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support system including fellow students and college personnel. Information regarding Smart Start has been shared with regional high schools regularly since Fall 2022 to encourage early enrollment. The cost of the program is \$199 with financial support and scholarships available.

Sessions will be held Monday through Friday on the East Peoria Campus or Peoria Campus and include the following date and time options: June 13-July 1 from 9 am-Noon, June 13-July 1 from 1-4 pm, July 11-July 29 from 9 am-Noon, or July 11-July 29 from 1-4 pm

"ReStart" is a free 4-week program designed to help those who have been out of high school for three or more years and have tried college previously. Individuals will refresh and upgrade their math, English, reading, and study skills. Small cohorts with dedicated mentors will help individuals develop college success strategies to prepare them for transitioning back into college. Each session contains activities to help individuals gain confidence and succeed in college, refresh and upgrade their academic skills, secure acceptance into an academic program, and gain awareness of college resources and support.

Sessions will be each Tuesday and Thursday on the Peoria Campus and include the following dates and times: July 5-28 from 5:30-8:30 pm.

Early registration is encouraged for both programs as enrollment is limited. "Smart Start" registration is available through June 1 at icc.edu/SmartStart. "ReStart" registration is available through June 17 at icc.edu/ReStart. For questions, please contact SmartStart@icc.edu.

Corporate & Community Education is experiencing some exciting increases in enrollments!

The Community Health Worker program is a collaboration between ICC and OSF through a grant received by OSF to develop and deliver non-credit CHW training based on criteria that had been developed at the state level. Community health workers (CHW's) help individuals, families, and communities enhance their health, access services, and to improve the conditions for health, especially in low0income communities. CHW's are typically from the communities they serve and so have a unique knowledge on the culture and linguistically appropriate services. CHW's learn how to provide a wide range of services, such as outreach, home visits, health education, and client-centered counseling and care management. The first cohort of 20 was delivered online in March to OSF employees and employees of other Federally Qualified Healthcare agencies in the state. The next two cohorts will also be filled by OSF employees before we begin to market more widely to other community-based organizations.

The cannabis dispensary operations training begins in June. Within three weeks of open registration, the first cohort of 24 was full with another 17 students enrolled in the fall session. This training is unique to other cannabis training programs around the state as it looks not only at dispensary operations but also incorporates GPEAK employability skills mentoring as part of the program. Through a gift from Trinity Compassionate Care, ICC is able to provide this training at no cost to students. This training program could be beneficial to students by leading them into business or horticulture programs at ICC to further their education and increase their marketability within the industry.

Marketing

Marketing organized activities to celebrate **Community College Month** in April. A "What Makes ICC Special?" video was created and shared during an All-College Update as well as on social media. Proclamations were organized with Peoria and East Peoria city governments. Post-it display walls were created at both Peoria and East Peoria campus for employees/students to add their comments. Professional headshot photoshoots were offered for all employees. Other deliverables included: posters, press release, emails, and social media on both the ICC and state ICCB accounts. Marketing supported the ICC Open House with event promotion including targeted emails, press release, posters, postcard mailer, digital signage and ads, targeted emails, and social media.

Summer & Fall Registration opened on April 4 and Marketing switched all communication to encourage students to "Register Now" including on-campus posters, digital signage, email communications, postcard mailer, and social media.

Marketing/Events supported the **Employee Recognition Ceremony** with event staff, invitations, communications, and a refreshed program design.

Hallway Career Posters were completed for Health Careers and Culinary programs to give a fresh look to the walls in time for the Simply Divine event. New 'snap frames' were installed on walls to allow more flexibility to update these posters with current economic statistics. Posters for other programs will follow this summer.

Marketing provided design, communication, and event support for the Foundation's annual **Simply Divine**, including production of formal invitations with RSVP and inserts, package mailing, donation cards, table numbers and menu cards, and signage.

Commencement planning and production were in full swing during
April with lots of communications to graduates and the ICC community. Beyond event logistics and recruiting volunteers, digital and printed materials such as the program, graduate toolkit, and signage were also worked on by Marketing.

Marketing finalized several **WEI videos**, one program overview and three individual success stories. A new ICC WEI brochure was created in addition to the video, to better showcase the ICC WEI program on a national level. An updated brochure for the statewide program was also completed.



Marketing continues work on the **web redesign** team writing content and photo collection.

Student Life projects, completed by Marketing student designers, this month included: Student Life Leadership Awards, SGA Carnival, Agri-Business Club Pork Chop Cookout, Sigma Kappa Delta Poetry Slam, and the Dodgeball Tournament.

APRIL 2022 ADMISSIONS REPORT

The Admissions Office held the ICC Open house at the month's beginning. We had 142 students attend and 310 people overall. In 2019 the last time we held this event, we had 254 people. We also had a two-day Health Careers Expo and 140 students attended from twenty-one high schools and an Admissions Visit day with 28 families. Then we finished the month with an Admissions Campus visit program with 28 families in attendance. We also completed the Success Luncheon series with Peoria Public Schools, with 115 students in attendance. Off-Campus, the office conducted 22 visits to area high schools four College fairs and met with over 110 students.

System-wise, we programmed all the Admissions summer events (Summer Campus Visit Days, Ready to Work, Coffee Meet-ups, and Rapid Enrollment Days). We also implemented several communication strategies for Success Luncheons, Visit Days, and Enrollment Services. We continue to review our data structure with Target X. Finally, we engaged with nearly 1100 incoming and outgoing phone calls.

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Finally, at the end of the month, the Admissions Representatives and the Director of Admissions attended the Illinois Association of College Admissions Counselors (IACAC) in Itasca, Illinois. The conference had over 650 people attending and was the first in-person professional development since 2019.

Administration & Finance

Audit Update

The College has recently received the final pieces of our 2020-2021 audit. On March 25, 2022, CliftonLarsonAllen LLP issued an unqualified opinion on the Certification of Chargeback Reimbursement and Schedule of Enrollment Data for the Year Ended June 30, 2021. No findings or issues were noted. The delay in the issuance of these reports was caused by a delay in reporting from the Illinois Community College Board caused by a system issue at their organization.

In addition, the College received on May 1, 2022 from CliftonLarsonAllen LLP unqualified opinions our Consolidated Year-End Financial Report and our Single Audit Report. No findings or issues were noted on the Consolidated Year-End Financial Report; however, a Significant Deficiency in Internal Control over Compliance was reported in the audit. A Significant Deficiency is the lowest level of finding that an organization can have. The finding was a result of the College posting quarterly reports after the required deadline on our website. The auditors did not find any issues with the disbursement of \$13,152,024 in Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) during their audit. There were no questions costs or return of funds required as a result of this matter. The College agrees with the finding and procedures have been put in place to meet all future reporting deadlines.

This completes the audit process for 2020-2021. The college is currently starting the planning process for the 2021-2022 audit.

IT / Technology Services

Huron Consulting is nearing the end of their ERP Business Process Review after interviewing over 100 ICC staff. Their ERP-related recommendations and findings will be presented to the newly-formed ERP Steering Committee for review and consideration.

The new ICC "Hub" (hub.icc.edu) was launched in May. This evolving internal website has been developed in conjunction with the upcoming new ICC external website. In addition to new service-related information, it houses portions of information formerly housed on the icc.edu website for students, ICC staff, and the general public. The site is built using Team Dynamix software and will enable a more service-oriented strategy supported by a more easily navigated knowledgebase structure.


