Western Illinois University Office of the Provost and Academic Vice President Illinois Central College, Graphic Communication 2+2 Agreement

Illinois Central College and Western Illinois University agree that if a student completes the Associate of Applied Science and is admitted to Western Illinois University, that student shall be eligible for this Articulation Agreement.

- This Articulation Agreement is only appropriate for students who transfer from Illinois Central
 College with an Associate of Applied Science that includes the general education courses, that are
 attached to this document, and who pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in Graphic
 Communication from Western Illinois University. The series of courses that must be taken to
 complete the baccalaureate degree at WIU are attached to this document.
- 2. The student must satisfactorily complete the course requirements at Western Illinois University to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Graphic Communication.
- 3. Students admitted under this 2+2 Agreement must meet all other graduation requirements as listed in the student undergraduate catalog at Western Illinois University.
- 4. If either Illinois Central College or Western Illinois University changes major program requirements, general education requirements, graduation requirements, this agreement is subject to renegotiation.

Graphic Communication

- This guide is an Associate of Applied Science degree completer plan that leads to a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Graphic Communication at WIU. Students will fill out applications for both schools, and consult the advisors and catalogs for both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed to ensure graduation in four years by taking courses at both Illinois Central College (ICC) and WIU. This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by ICC and admissions requirements for WIU.
- Students will be required to complete specific major requirements at ICC. Upon completing the first two years requirements at ICC, students will receive an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree. Students will be required to complete core and major course requirements at WIU, and upon completion of the final two years plus a semester curriculum requirements will receive a B.S. degree with a major in Graphic Communication. In general, a maximum of 60 semester hours (s.h.) will be taken at ICC at ICC rates and minimum of 69 s.h. from WIU at WIU rates.

Notes for ICC:

- 1. A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale is required;
- 2. A "C" grade or higher is required in order for transfer students to receive general education credit for a writing course;

3. Class fulfills History and International Awareness requirements;

- 4. Additional math prerequisites may be required based on student's Math/Algebra placement scores. Students would be required to complete these pre-requisite classes with a grade of C or higher. Courses below college level will not apply toward graduation;
- 5. To fulfill this degree, students should consult a faculty advisor from their area of interest for suggestions regarding course selection from their specific Area of Concentration (a minimum of 12 hours in Area of Concentration is required).
- A working knowledge and understanding of computer literacy is required. See your advisor for requirements.
