- Courses taken at a community college will not be used toward upper division requirements. 40 semester hours of upper division credit is required for a Bachelor's Degree. These courses are to be taken at the senior level institution.
- Foreign Language is a graduation requirement. Two full years of high school foreign language with a "C" average or completion of the second semester of a college foreign language will satisfy this requirement.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Transfer students with 29 or fewer hours must complete MUS 1103 (5) times; 30-59 transfer hours must complete MUS 1103 (4) times; 60 or more transfer hours must complete MUS 1103 (3) times.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> Completion of the Advanced Study Jury is required in order to complete the Junior Recital.
